
4-H RULES AND REGULATIONS

2018/2019

4-H Division General Rules

Check each Division/Department for Special Rules and Requirements that may apply.

Exhibitors must be enrolled in 4-H by November 1, to be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair.

1. Any member currently enrolled who has met fair entry requirements as set forth by the 4-H Program.
2. Fair entry forms and required project record sheets must be submitted to the Community Club leader according to 4-H deadlines. Community leaders shall submit all eligible forms to the Extension Office according to deadline date.
3. All exhibitors must abide by the rules and regulations of each 4-H Division, Class, and Lot.
4. Non-animal exhibits will be released on Sunday.
5. Exhibitors must remain with their exhibits until the superintendent accepts the entries. Superintendent of the department will make all assignments of space for exhibits.
6. Exhibitors will give the necessary and personal attention to whatever they may have on exhibit and at the close of the Fair will take charge of same.
7. Each exhibitor may make only one entry per lot except where otherwise indicated.
8. Entries must represent the project year the 4-H member is enrolled.

9. Exhibitors may enter only the articles in the class which corresponds to the project being carried. Any article not meeting this specification will be for display only.

10. All ages referred to in 4-H section are determined as of January 1 of the current year.

- Junior 9 – 11
- Intermediate 12-13
- Senior 14 and over

11. Standard of Attire: La Paz County 4-H members will wear as a standard attire for the showing and selling in the auction as follows:

- Dark blue or black pants, worn outside of shoes
- Long sleeved solid white or Kelly/hunter green tucked in collared shirt that fastens in front. If members do not have a shirt available, they are to contact the 4-H office, or their 4-H leader and arrangements will be to have one available for use.
- Close toed black or brown, leather or canvas shoes.
- Nose jewels, lip piercing jewelry and ear gauges will not be allowed on the exhibitors, during the show or auction.

Judging will be done on the Danish System.

Department "C" 4-H Agriculture & General Project 2018/19

Rules & Regulations

1. Exhibitors must have been enrolled in 4-H by November 1st, to be eligible to participate in the La Paz County Fair.
2. All exhibits must be entered on the Tuesday prior to the fair from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.
3. All exhibitors must be enrolled in the specific project they are exhibiting in.
4. The department reserves the right to remove any entry that is considered inappropriate.
5. All exhibits will be released on Sunday. 4-H members must pick up their exhibit on Sunday unless arrangement have been. Any items left at the fair ground will be discarded on Monday after the fair is completed.
6. Check each project area for special rules.
7. The general information for this department will be carefully followed
8. Three entries per lot unless otherwise stated.
9. Exhibitors work is expected to progress appropriately as age and experience in the project increases. All work must be done by the exhibitor with minimal help from others.
10. All exhibits will be judged on skills learned/applied, workmanship, overall effectiveness/quality and usefulness.
11. All exhibitors will complete interview for their project in official dress.
12. Entries that are taken for an interview will receive two ribbons. One for the interview that is marked interview and one for the project. All others will only receive one.
13. All posters are not to exceed 22 X 28 inches. No tri folds.

Division A– Photography

1. All multiple prints, photo stores, slides, etc. must be captioned.
2. All single print enlargements must be 5" x 7" or larger and mounted on 11x14 poster or mat board. Colored or black and white.
3. Photography members must also state camera model and film type or digital camera on an information card.
 - Class 1 – 1 & 2 years – color
 - Class 2 – 3 & 4 years – color
 - Class 3 – 5 years & up – color
 - Class 4 – 1 & 2 years - black and white
 - Class 5 – 3 & 4 years – black and white
 - Class 6 – 5 years & up – black and white
 - Lot: 1 – Nature
 - Lot: 2 – Scenic
 - Lot: 3 – Building/Structure
 - Lot: 4 – This is 4-H (must be obvious)
 - Lot: 5 - Close ups
 - Lot: 6 – Portraits
 - Lot: 7 – Agriculture/Farming
 - Lot: 8 - General – may include use of special effects and/or trick photography
 - Lot: 9 - Educational exhibits

4. An exhibit should include 3 servings. Serving sizes should be 4 x 4 pieces.
5. Classes 9 through 14 will be tasted by the judges.
6. Classes 14 through 20 will be judges on evidence of youth involvement, workmanship and design.
